Teaching and learning processes that pay attention to the specific needs of girls and boys.

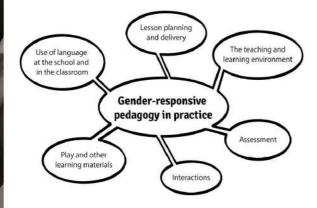
The processes include:

- lesson planning
- teaching
- organising and managing the classroom
- · managing other forms of interaction

Why GRP?

- GRP is relevant in teaching and learning processes, and outside the classroom, as it plays a big role in determining learners' access to and retention, participation and performance in school.
- · GRP prompts teachers to reflect on their own beliefs about traditional gender roles. It helps teachers to provide equal opportunities for all learners to engage and learn, regardless of their sex, and it provides them with the opportunity to give adequate attention to gender issues in teaching and in all interactions both within and outside of the classroom.
- GRP guides teachers and school leaders to support equality among the sexes, inspires teachers to observe all children and to address individual differences in needs and skills, and promotes inclusive environments and well-being.

- Gender-responsive planning and monitoring;
- Distributed leadership to strengthen the school's gender responsiveness;

- Enriching the curriculum to be more gender-responsive
- Improving conditions for gender-responsive teaching and learning
- Building gender-responsive relationships within and outside of the school community
- Gender-responsive policy on child safety and protection
